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GETTING STARTED

TEACHING TUTORS

Select **Teaching Tutors** to access a professional development series for teacher use. There are five tutors in all: Reading K, Reading 1, Reading 2-5, Language Arts K-1, and Language Arts 2-5. Program and level-specific information is presented by chapter. Videos attached to many of the topics provide authentic examples of real classroom instruction by trained teachers. You can use the searchable index to find both topics and videos on a variety of topics such as optimal pacing, classroom arrangement, characteristics of daily lessons, error correction, and achieving mastery. Select **Placement Tests** to access the placement tests for every level of the program including reading and language arts. (Figure 32)



Vocabulary from CLC

SRA 2INFORM

The **SRA 2Inform** application can accessed through the instructroduction screen. Once you click on the application, you will be able to select the application, access **SRA 2Inform** Professional Learning Environment, the user's guide for teachers and administrators, and the import spreadsheet (Figure 34).
