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GETTING STARTED




INTERACTIVE WHITEBOARD DISPLAYS

Figure 8 shows an example of a Display only.



If an interactive whiteboard is not available, teachers can still use the editing features of ConnectED to model the strategy for students by clicking on the edit tool at the top right corner of the screen.



SRA 2INFORM

The **SRA 2Inform** application can accessed through the introduction screen. 




